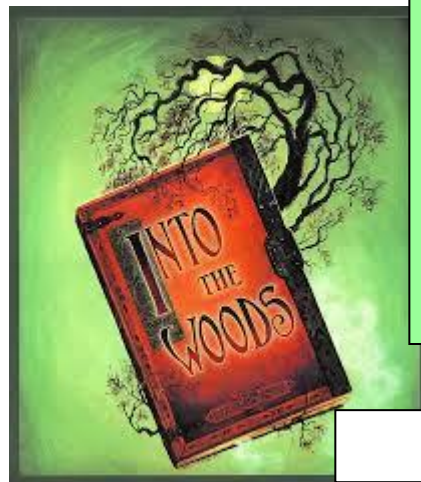


### PSED

This term the children will be using the PSHE lessons to explore important relationships to them. The class will learn about different types of families and will be encouraged to reflect upon how they can show care towards the important people in their lives.

The children will continue to develop their friendship skills with a particular focus on the best way to respond to unkind behaviour, how to be a good friend and coping with disagreements.



### UTW

This term the children will be learning about the importance of looking after the environment. They will learn ways that they can have a positive impact.

The children will be further exploring nature through observation, planting and observing change.

To improve their understanding of the Queen's Jubilee we will be looking at Kings and Queens throughout history and in stories.

### Physical Development

PE this term will include learning to move our bodies with increasing control and grace, as we learn a choreographed dance.

The children will continue practising their ball skills and will be creating obstacle courses to safely navigate.

In class and at Forest School the children will be developing their skills using tools.

## Into the Woods: Term 5

### Mathematics

This term the children will be consolidating their number bonds to 10, supporting automatic recall.

The children will be exploring pattern in the number system as we count beyond 10.

This term, maths lessons will focus on solving addition and subtraction problems practically.

The children's understanding of shape will be developed to investigate rotation and orientation.

Children will be introduced to measuring capacity and consolidate their use of language to describe length and size.

### EAD

This term the children will have lots of opportunities to retell familiar traditional fairy tales through role play. The children will be encouraged to create their own costumes and props and perform their stories to one another.

The children will be using different mediums to create art from observations of nature and using natural objects to create art.

Our artist study this term will focus on the work of William Morris.

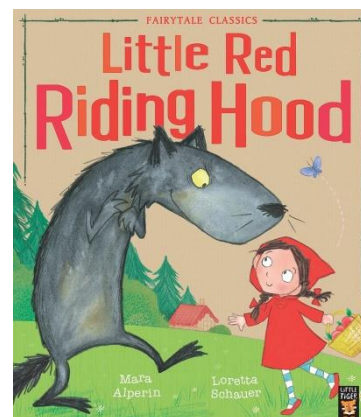


### Literacy

This term the children will be exploring a range of traditional tales with a focus on the tale of Little Red Riding Hood. The class will learn to identify, discuss and compare the key features, looking for similarities and differences such as setting, characters, main plot points and themes.

In addition to this, the class will be learning how to use non-fiction texts to find information. They will also be writing labels and captions to go with their observational drawings of nature.

They will be writing stories and creating posters.



### Communication & Language

Children will continue learning new vocabulary, focusing on nature and the environment.

The children will be supported to speak in detail about things that they find interesting.

The children will be focusing on adding explanations to their thoughts and ideas and asking questions using who, what, where, when, why and how.
