


Welcome back to the next addition of our reading newsletter dedicated only to books!


Congratulations!!

Each phase has set text(s) for reading and writing that develop core objectives and key skills. This is what each year group will be studying during Spring 2.



Izzy and her friends are SO EXCITED about their school trip. They're going camping and there'll be marshmallows and no washing and everything. But






### Year 5/6: "Boy in the Tower" by Polly Ho-Yen.

Ade loves living at the top of a tower block. From his window, he feels like he can see the whole world stretching out beneath him.

But one day, other tower blocks on the estate start falling down around them and strange, menacing plants begin to appear.

Now their tower isn't safe anymore. Ade and his mum are trapped and there's no way out . . .



### **KS2 NON – FICTION: "The Big History Timeline** Wallbook" by Christopher Lloyd.

Explore the world from the beginning of time until the present, in this amazing, over-sized timeline book

that brings history to life! The timeline is uniquely broken out into 12 sections, including by subject areas (such as sea, land) and continents, as well as by date, with over 1,000 pictures and captions. From the rise of the dinosaur to the creation of the smart phone, the nearly 2-metre timeline allows you to compare events across the world at any given moment in time.
